

## HURON SUNRISE TRAIL

### Points of Interest

1. **Harbor View:** Great Lakes freighters load stone from Michigan Limestone Operations' quarry, the world's largest open pit limestone mine. The plant's crusher, stone conveyors and stockpiles are also visible from Harbor View.
2. **Harbor View Road:** This private gravel road provides seasonal access to Harbor View. The gate is open during summer daylight hours.
3. **South Shore Park:** A half-mile of Lake Huron shoreline provides swimming, beach-combing and kayak launching. Four softball and Little League diamonds are open for public use.
4. **Bungalow Row:** The fine Craftsman-style bungalows on Lake Street were built in the early 1900s by U.S. Steel to house company executives who worked at the nearby Calcite quarry and port.
5. **Lakeside Park:** Rogers City's pride and joy, with swimming and picnicking facilities, along with beach volleyball, an extensive playground and the Rogers City Band and Performance Shell. Outdoor concerts in the park are held during the summer. The Sailors' Memorial honors local men who perished in shipwrecks on the Great Lakes.
6. **The Pavilion Grill** serves ice cream, burgers, salads and drinks, with deck seating overlooking Lake Huron. The adjacent picnic pavilion may be reserved for group celebrations. Open seasonally.
7. **Rogers City Marina:** The City's 145-slip small boat harbor is a delightful place to stroll. Watch boat launch action from our new gazebo.
8. **Breakwater Path and Fishing Platform:** Try your luck with Rogers City salmon on the fishing platform, or see a great sunset from the breakwall.
9. **Public Works Park:** The trail wraps around the Rogers City Sewage Treatment Plant. Wire mesh rock-filled gabions protect the plant from high water, and frame the view over Lake Huron.
10. **North Shore Park:** Built on an old rail right-of-way, this park now offers beach and picnic areas. Note adjacent motel, bar and restaurant.

11. **Riverview:** From Linden Street, turn east on Riverview Street one block to see the Trout River entering Lake Huron at Riverview Park.

12. **Seagull Point:** Sunsets are spectacular at Seagull Point. Picnic facilities are available, with great views of the Rogers City shoreline.

13. **Seagull Point Park:** This park features a mile of pristine beach and dunes. Fossilized corals are found on this beach. The paved trail travels through unspoiled forest, bridging two streams. Foot trails provide beach access.

14. **Trout River Park:** The trail follows the banks of the Trout River through a mature mixed conifer and hardwood forest, crossing the Trout River Bridge and entering a meadow picnic area.

15. **Herman Vogler Conservation Area:** Seven miles of hiking, biking, and ski paths connect to the Huron Sunrise Trail in this 270-acre preserve.

16. **Pond Overlook:** A trailhead picnic area is located on a point overlooking the dam and pond on Trout River. The impoundment provides excellent wildlife and waterfowl habitat.

17. **Shore Road:** The trail travels one half mile on street before entering a public beach along US 23.

18. **MDOT Wayside:** A picnic table nestled in the pines gives majestic vistas over Lake Huron. The trail winds through dune and shore areas.

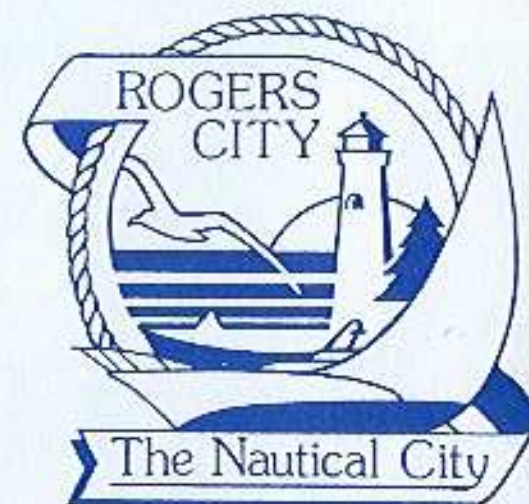
19. **MDOT Wayside & Beach:** This wayside includes beach, picnic and parking facilities.

20. **Hoelt State Park:** This magnificent 300-acre lake front park has 142 camp sites and a day use area with swimming, playground and picnic facilities. The rustic stone and log picnic pavilion, built in 1937 by the CCC, is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. Bikes and walkers enter the parks free; entry fee for autos.

21. **Future Link to Forty Mile Point:** Plans include extending the Huron Sunrise trail two miles north to 40 Mile Point Lighthouse Park.
